

# Application of the Hui Process/Meihana Model to Clinical Practice

## GENERAL COURSE FOR HEALTH PROFESSIONALS – OVERVIEW

All learners will complete the following modules.

### MODULE 1

An online module providing the context of Hauora Māori in 2018;

- Review of the context for Māori health including the Treaty of Waitangi and health, the impact of colonisation, systemic and clinical bias, and the role of health literacy.
- Orientation to the Hui Process/Meihana Model within clinical practice.
- Involves two formative assessments (Assessment 1 and 2) which must be passed prior to completing Module 2.
- **Approx 6 hours to complete, available from 4 April 2018**

### MODULE 2

A one day face to face training seminar in Christchurch on 14 May 2018, inclusive of:

- Team based learning activities to further orientate learners to the Hui Process and Meihana Model.
- Simulated patient sessions to practice application of the Hui Process and Meihana Model to clinical practice.
- The role of te reo Māori in health settings.
- **Approximately 8 hours (9am- 5pm), 14 May 2018**

### MODULE 3

An online module which provides an opportunity for learners to demonstrate their understanding of the Hui Process and Meihana Model in clinical practice.

- Complete formative assessment 3. This is a paper based question with specific clinical information that you are required to complete on Moodle. (1 hour)
- Complete formative assessment 4. Between 22 May – 6 August you are invited to identify a Māori patient/client you are working with, or is within your service/clinic. Then seek consent to interview the Māori patient (with or without whānau present) (1 hour). Then utilising the Hui Process/Meihana Model organise the information you have and using the template provided develop a powerpoint presentation (10 slides) that you can deliver in 10 minutes that will best demonstrate how you have applied the model to your patient – and how it has informed your understanding of her presenting complaint and potential (or actual) management of the patient. (1-2 hours). You then record your presentation via your phone and upload it to Moodle to be marked. (15 minutes).
- Both formative assessments will be graded, if pass criteria are not met learners will have the opportunity to resubmit after feedback from initial submission is received (formative assessment).
- **Approx 4.5 hours, undertaken between Module 2 and 6 August 2018**

At the completion of the course those learners who have completed and passed all required formative assessments and attended Module 2 (full day) will be accredited with a Pass in the overall course, and receive a formal University of Otago certification of completing and passing this course.

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
